▲ WHAT IS COMPASS?

COMPASS is the new electronic health record for the SETON Healthcare Network. COMPASS provides a single repository for clinical information entry and review, creating a seamless patient encounter while improving patient safety.

As with any major change, the transition from Browser PA to COMPASS will take time. To ensure a safe and easy conversion, COMPASS is being introduced in three phases. Phase I (which began in May with the implementation at Brackenridge and Children's Hospitals) transitions all Seton associates, physicians and their offices/clinics from Browser PA to COMPASS to view patient information and lab/rad results. Phase 2 focuses on electronic orders and documentation by Seton nursing and ancillary staff. Phase 3 is Computerized Physician Order Entry, which will directly affect every physician with privileges at any Seton facility.

This effort, along with several other Seton Information Systems initiatives currently underway, is the most efficient and economical way to rapidly increase patient safety, improve operations and provide the essential information needed to improve health care for those we serve. COMPASS is vital to answering Seton's "Call to Action" to provide *Healthcare That Works, Healthcare That Is Safe, and Healthcare That Leaves No One Behind.*
